Dr. Magdaleno has been described as an "equity warrior". He regularly speaks and consults focusing on matters of equity and leadership. CLEAR's primary goals are the development of social justice educational leaders, the growth and retention of leaders of color through coaching and mentoring, addressing equity issues throughout the educational system and researching the impact of positive leadership models on underrepresented groups.

Dr. Magdaleno most recently served as Director of the Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership at California State University, Fresno and also served as Department Chair of the master's program in educational leadership. Prior to entering higher education, Dr. Magdaleno served the students of California as an elementary school principal, middle school teacher, assistant principal and principal, high school teacher, coach, and guidance counselor. Dr. Magdaleno earned his Doctorate in Educational Leadership from UCLA and also holds a master's degree in counseling and guidance and a bachelor's degree in Social Science from California Lutheran University.

His published works include Factors Impeding the Social and Academic Progress of African American Males in Foster Care; Educational Leaders and the Acknowledgement Gap (Journal of School Leadership, 2016), Equation for Access (Cabinet Support +Staff Mentorship) = A Leadership Pipeline (International Mentoring Association, 2014 with Dr. Cynthia Teniente - Matson) and Mentoring Latina and Latino Leaders in Keeping and Improving Tomorrow's School Leaders (Rowman and Littlefield Education, 2010). His primary research interests are areas of equity, critical race theory, social justice, leadership mentoring and developing educational leaders of color.
